

Examination Time?

Examine, O God, and search me; test my heart and mind. Test and confirm, O Lord, one way or the other, who and what I am; search my heart and mind... You Scribble furiously for several hours in an examination hall, knowing that your whole future may depend on what you produce during that time, is a daunting prospect indeed – no less welcome than it's ever been.

Some thrive under such conditions and are able to perform under pressure.

A few have the happy ability of being able to study in the required facts during an intensive spell of revision, even though they'll forget most of what they've learnt immediately after exam.

Others, however, despite having an excellent grasp of the subject in question, will go to pieces and end up failing miserably. The only advice we can give at such a time, and the only fair expectation we can have of any examinee, is that they do their best.

Thankfully God doesn't ask us to sit exams, or demand that we meet a certain pass mark. He knows and understands our limitations and doesn't set impossible standards that we must somehow attain.

The one thing he does ask is that we're truly committed, serious about discipleship rather than simply playing at it. In that sense and especially during this season of Lent, its well worth asking God to examine us to help us understand where we're at in our lives: what progress we've made in faith, where our strengths and weaknesses lie.

He doesn't expect us to come out with flying colours, to be top of the class; he wants only to help us learn more of his ways in this season of reflection and giving up.

If we give our best in that, we can be sure God will make up what is lacking.

I pray that may God help you to identify the things that ruin your life and enable you to remove those things and prepare your heart to discover more of God and His unconditional love which he manifested in the sacrifice of His beloved Son, Jesus, on the cross. Amen

I take this opportunity to wish all a very Happy Easter when it comes. God bless you.

The writer of this hymn, Joseph Scriven b. 1855 had to face many trials. He was born in Ireland and lost his fiancé just before their marriage. She drowned. He3 moved to Canada for a new start. He was a preacher and teacher and was engaged to be married once again but tragedy struck again, and his fiancé died suddenly. We all have trials to face as we go through life, but this hymn is a constant reminder to me that there is always someone that I can turn to.

"Amazing Grace" was written by John Newton.

John Newton's mother died when he was 7 and he was put to work with his father in the shipping business in London. He went to sea with the Royal Navy.

He was the captain of a ship involved in slave trading. The ship was damaged in a storm off the Irish coast and he promised God that he would change if he could be saved. He became an anti-slavery campaigner and wrote this hymn as a testament to his conversion to Christianity. He was ordained as the minister of St Peter and St Paul Olney, England.

Squash: 20p per glass



Gift Aid It



What is Gift Aid?

This is a government scheme which allows the congregation (as a registered charity) to reclaim the tax you have already paid on the money you give in your offering.

How does the church benefit?

While the basic rate of Income Tax is 20%, the congregation can recover the tax at the rate of 25%- e.g. £4 becomes £5

£20 becomes £25

£40 becomes £50

Who can give through Gift Aid?

Anyone who pays **Income Tax** or Capital Gains Tax which is annually at least equal to the tax which the congregation and other charities to which you make Gift Aid donations will reclaim on your gifts for that year.

What is Required?

Sign a Gift Aid Declaration- this is printed in the church magazineready for you to complete. Hand this to your elder or anyone on door duty on a Sunday or you can call Jean Duff, Gift Aid Convenor, on 01324 824768 and she will come and collect the completed form.

Give your offering using Offering Envelopes or by Bank Standing Order or by Cheque - to provide the Church with the necessary records of your giving.

You Do Not Need:

- To Promise to give a particular amount
- To promise to give for a specific period

INGREDIENTS

50G SELF RAISING FLOUR

50G MARGARINE

50 G CASTOR SUGAR

1 EGG

DECORATION

50G MARGARINE

100G ICING SUGAR

SUGAR PASTE CHICKS

METHOD

- 1 SET OVEN AT 180 DEGREES C
- 2 sieve flour in to a large bowl then add the egg margarine and sugar
- 3 beat until light smooth and creamy
- 4 divide into paper cases
- 5 bake in oven for 15/20 minutes
- 6 remove from tin and cool on a wire tray
- 7 decorate using sugar paste sticks

The Driving Force

The Driving Force is a charity which takes anyone who has cancer and is registered with a GP in Bonnybridge, Banknock or Denny to hospital appointments for free.

Local volunteers work together to fundraise, co-ordinate and drive cancer patients to and from hospital appointments and treatment sessions. Kidney dialysis patients also benefit from this service.

There are 3 types of volunteers: drivers, co-ordinators and fundraisers. Drivers can volunteer to give as much time as they wish. While some drivers offer their services 5 days a week, Monday to Friday, many offer to drive 2 days or some 1 day.

Co-ordinators volunteer on a rota system and arrange a driver for each patient's journey and contact the patient with their driver's details. They contact the GP surgery daily to pick up the messages left by the patients. Fundraisers are very important to help with the prize bingo and coffee morning etc.

Haggs Church supports the Driving Force regularly with proceeds of Soup and Sandwich lunches etc being donated to the charity. 3 members of our congregation volunteer as driver's and I volunteer as a co-ordinator. If you, or someone you know require the services of the Driving Force, please contact your GP surgery and leave your name and phone number and the on-call co-ordinator will contact you for your requirements. The Facebook page, The Driving Force, is a good way to find out more about the charity.

My daughter, Caroline, is doing the Kiltwalk in April and has chosen the Driving Force as her charity. To boost her sponsor money I am organising a fun night in Haggs Church Hall on Friday 12th April- more details to follow. Tickets will be available soon.

Easter Rocky Road




Ingredients

- 175g/6oz dark <u>chocolate</u>, broken into pieces
- 125g/4½ oz milk chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 75g/2\frac{2}{4}oz unsalted butter, diced
- 160g/5\frac{3}{4}oz sugar-coated mini chocolate eggs
- 200g/7oz digestives or rich tea biscuits, broken into pieces
- 75q/2\frac{3}{4}oz mini marshmallows
- 50g/1\(\frac{3}{4}\) oz hazelnuts, roughly chopped
- 75g/2³/₄oz raisins

Method

- 1. Line a 20x30cm/8x12in baking tin with baking paper.
- 2. Place the dark and milk chocolate pieces in a large heatproof bowl and add the golden syrup and butter. Set the bowl over a pan of barely simmering water but do not allow the bottom of the bowl to touch the water. Stir from time to time until the butter and chocolate are melted and the mixture is smooth. Remove from the heat and leave to cool for 5 minutes if this is too hot the marshmallows will melt.
- 3. Cut the chocolate mini eggs in half (leaving a few whole) and set aside one third of the eggs, including the whole ones for decorating. Gently fold in the chocolate eggs, biscuits, marshmallows, nuts and raisins into the chocolate mixture and mix to combine. Spoon into the prepared tin and spread level using the back of the spoon. Scatter with the reserved whole and halved mini eggs.
- 4. Refrigerating for at least 1 hour, or until completely firm. Cut into bars to serve.

Ruth was brought up in Cumbernauld on the family farm, where she worked hard to help her parents run the farm. She met Archie Gallacher at a young farmers meeting and as they say the rest is history.

They moved to the holding at Longcroft where Archie and Ruth kept a few animals. One of my memories of Ruth is when I saw her in an oversized pair of wellingtons chasing cows along Kilsyth Road, trying to steer them down the coal brae and back into the field they had escaped from.

Ruth was ordained as an elder and took her duties seriously. She visited her district often and got to know her "People". Her kindness and generosity were overwhelming with many a bunch of flowers left hanging on doorknobs or surprise Christmas gifts deposited on the doorstep. Ruth was the fairy godmother to so many. She gave generously to the Foodbank and to the Shoebox appeal and to many more good causes.
